Fall Recitals

Our Fall Recitals will be held on Saturday, November 17 at England Piano at 3740 DeKalb Tech Parkway, Doraville for the Chamblee school, and Sunday,

November 18 at Piano Works at 2805 Buford Highway, Duluth for the Alpharetta school.

Students who perform will receive a certificate.

These recitals are formal performances and we should observe the following rules:

1. **Be on time.** The recital will start *promptly*. Performers should arrive at least 15 minutes before the recital to be lined up at the front in the order of performance in the program. If you are late and the recital has already started, you should notify the teacher and *wait quietly* at the back. They will arrange the program or let you play last.

2. **Dress Code.** Participants should *dress up* for the occasion. Blue Jeans, T-shirts, platform shoes and short mini skirts are not appropriate.

3. **Manners.** Performers need a quiet environment to concentrate and try to do their best. Interruptions like talking and going in and out of the room can bother the performer, as well as the audience members who are trying to listen.

The Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music

The Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM) Exams will be held from Saturday, November 10 to Tuesday, November 13 at our Chamblee school and Wednesday, November 14 to Saturday, November 17 at our Alpharetta school. The examiner is Mr. Barry Clark from the U.K.

Each year over 600,000 students take these exams in more than 90 countries around the world knowing that their achievements will be recognized internationally.

Six teachers from Cambridge sent 34 students to participate in the practical exam this session. Subjects include piano and violin, and grade levels range from Grade 1 to Grade 7. Students will play three pieces and the scale requirements, and participate in aural and sight-reading tests. Seven students will take the Preparatory Test. Students will play 2 pieces, technical tunes, and participate in musical games.

Best wishes to these students as they prepare for this high standard examination.



Federation Gold Cup Festival
